This house will offer an opportunity for an individual or family to move from homelessness to a more sustainable life. We'd love to finish raising those funds so the house can be completed! We want to tell someone or a family this Christmas, "There is Room in the Inn!" So, any undesignated funds given on Christmas Eve will be dedicated to this project.

Service of the Longest Night


