'Am I Saved?' Worship Series Starts Jan. 11

Launching Sunday, Jan. 11, we are kicking off a new sermon series titled, "Am I Saved?" Salvation is a topic that can both be confusing and exciting. As United Methodists, we have a distinct understanding of salvation and what it means to be "saved." After all, salvation is core to our faith and God's work in the world. But what does it mean that God saves us? What does that salvation include? What are we being saved from? What are we being saved for? How do we know we are saved? Who is saved?

Other denominations have distinct understandings of salvation. Often, it is viewed through the lens of death and eternal life. Yet, salvation Scripturally is so much more. It's more than just a prayer said and more than just about life everlasting, according to us as United Methodists. (In fact, I'd say it is so much more for most Christian Denominations). Yet, we've often boiled God's grand work of redemption and



reconciliation down to a single moment in our lives.

So throughout the month of January and February, we are going to explore our understanding of Salvation as we read Scripture and consider what it means to be those whom God is rescuing and redeeming.

Christmas Day at Conway FUMC



The Church and Society Committee at Conway First United Methodist Church recently presented checks to three local non-profit organizations. The funds were made possible through the Elizabeth T. and John S. Workman Social Justice Fund.

Aimee Prince, executive director at Bethlehem House, accepted a check of \$1,857 from Church and Society co-chairman Sarah Coker. Bethlehem House helps fill the gap for individuals and families experiencing homelessness by providing temporary housing while they are motivated, encouraged, and empowered to become independent, productive, and self-sufficient.

McKinley Hess of Conway Cradle Care accepted a check of \$1,857 from church member Mariana Linck. Conway Cradle Care is a childcare and outreach program that empowers

expectant and parenting adolescents in their pursuit of an advanced education.

A check for \$1,857 was delivered to the Conway Ministry Center to be used for their new project, The Refuge. Receiving the check from church member Katherine Butt were Sarah Wilson, executive director; Spring Hunter, board chair; and Derrick Marshall, board member of the Conway Ministry Center.

The Refuge, an innovative solution to emergency shelter organized by the Ministry Center, is set to open soon. It was created through the purchase of a 22-unit motel on South Harkrider Street, which is being converted into studio shelter units that will house families with children and vulnerable individuals with medical needs.
