Ash Wednesday and the Start of Lent

Before we know it, the liturgical season of Lent will arrive, and with it a plethora of religious practices to help us prepare for the celebration of Easter. Among these practices are feasting, fasting, joy, worship, contemplation, prayer and

Lent is a period of 40 days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lencten," which means "spring." In 2025, Lent runs from Wednesday, March 5, through Saturday, April 19. Easter Day is Sunday, April 20.

Join us on March 5 at 5:30 p.m. in the Great Hall for a delicious pancake and sausage dinner as we prepare our hearts for this meaningful season. The pancake dinner is a fun and symbolic tradition, marking the start of Lent by using up rich ingredients before the season of fasting and reflection. This year, the Wesley Foundation will be hosting the dinner as a fundraiser for their missions! The cost of the meal is a suggested donation of \$7 per person or \$28 max per family.

After dinner (at about 6:30 p.m.), we will make our way to the Sanctuary, where ashes will be imposed, reminding us of our mortality and dependence on God's grace. Come for the pancakes, stay for the sacred moment, and begin your Lenten journey with us. All are welcome!

During Lent, we will focus on what God has done for us through Christ's death and prepare for the good news of life through Christ's resurrection. Through this season, we share in Christ's sacrifice and rejoice in the life that comes through Christ. Our pastors have planned a new worship series based on the theme, "What Does the Lord Require of You?"

Ash Wednesday is intended to be a time for us to confess our sin before God within the community of faith. The use of ashes has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship. With the mark of the ashes, we are reminded that we are mortal and that our hope is found in the grace of God through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Imposition of Ashes is a powerful nonverbal way of participating in the call to repent.


Noonday Prayer During Lent

In order to set aside more time for prayer during the season of Lent, Conway First United Methodist Church will offer a service of Noonday Prayer at 12:10 p.m. each Friday from March 7 through April 11.

Each of these meditative services lasts approximately 30 to 40 minutes, and includes, besides the customary prayers, a brief lesson from Scripture, the recitation of Psalm 11, and one congregational hymn.

Central to our Lenten Noondays is an opportunity for private prayer and contemplation. Each week, an organist from Central Arkansas will play three works from the repertoire which are especially conducive to personal reflection, prayer, and introspection. Each service of this year's Lenten Noonday Prayer series, titled "Fruits of the Spirit," will express one of the appointed weekly themes which correspond to the Lenten sermon series, "What Does the Lord Require of You?" Confession, Faithfulness, Self-Control, Patience, Justice, and Compassion.

This is the fourth year to offer Noonday Prayer on the Fridays of Lent at FUMC. Adding this valuable spiritual practice to our observance of the fasting time has been a blessing, not only to our own parishioners, but also to many in the Conway and Central Arkansas communities who have incorporated these meaningful opportunities for prayer into their personal Lenten discipline, some traveling considerable distances to be with us on Fridays. All are welcome to attend as you are able.

Helping Our Neighbors

Members of FUMC's Church and Society Committee recently attended a webinar titled "A UMC Conversation: The Journey with Migrant, Immigrant, and Refugee Communities." The stated mission of the webinar was to "prayerfully reflect on (immigration) developments and unite around our core Christian principles of welcoming the stranger, treating all people with dignity and respect, and showing compassion for those in vulnerable situations."

During the webinar, panelists from border-point ministries shared experiences welcoming and working with migrant, immigrant, and refugee communities. Many resources were made available to help congregations support their members and neighbors in navigating developments in immigration policies.

To offer guidance and support within our own community, the Church and Society Committee prepared bilingual Know Your Rights cards, placing one in each food pantry box distributed on Thursday, Jan. 30. In addition, Know Your Rights flyers, printed in English and Spanish, are available at desks near each of our main entrances.




