Holy Week at Conway FUMC

It won't be long before we are waving palm branches on a Sunday and imagining the people of Jerusalem shouting Hosanna as Jesus entered the city for the last days of his life. Only Jesus fully understood what his last week would entail; the disciples didn't have a clue. Only in retrospect, were the disciples able to see and understand.

In the same way, we look back to the last week of Jesus' life through the lens of the Resurrection uncovering what God has done for us through him. For the Church, this last week, Holy Week, is the most important time of the year. Within three days, God changed the world. Because of this, we intentionally slow down to take it in and ask God's Spirit to continue to inspire and enlighten us.

This year, we hope to see you at our varied Holy Week Services. Palm Sunday services are part of our normal Sunday schedule and take place on April 13. Our children will be able to process and wave palm branches in each service during the opening hymn.

On April 17, we will gather at 6:30 p.m. in the Great Hall for our Maundy Thursday Service. During this service, we will hear once again Jesus mandate (Maundy comes from the Latin word, mandatum) to "Eat this Bread, and Drink this Cup." We will gather for worship and communion that evening.

On April 18, we will gather at 6:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary for our Good Friday Service. Through this service, we will walk through the final hours of Jesus' life as

we recall his arrest, trial, and crucifixion.

And, if you're so inclined, you may join our choirs at 8:30 and 11 a.m. in the Sanctuary to sing the Handel's "Hallelujah" chorus from Messiah at the end of worship. Music will be available in the balcony.

Financial Update for February 2025

From Rev. Nathan Kilbourne: We are doing well so far this year

financially.

At the end of February, we were \$50,000 ahead of expenses. This is normal for our congregation as we get ahead during the early winter months, and then as summer time hits our expenses rise due to HVAC costs and the like. So the more we are able to stay ahead, the more we are able to bring to fruition the plans God has in store for us as a congregation.

Moreover, our Capital Campaign is going really well. To date, we now owe \$325,000 on our loan! In other words, we've paid off around \$825,000 worth of principal since the kick off of the campaign in fall last year! Thank you so much for your generosity as we tackle phase 1 of the campaign of paying off our debt!



Conway FUMC Staff Changes Children's Ministry Update Jill Hankins

From Rev. Nathan Kilbourne and Richard Counts, chairman of the Staff Parish Relations Committee:

We wanted to provide an update to the church as to what is happening in the Children's Ministry after Jules Koen, our Co-Director of Children's Ministry, made the decision to step down at the end of February. In the interim, Catherine Gatlin, our other Co-Director of Children's Ministry, is going to step into the position of full-time Director of Children's Ministry until the staff parish is able to hire a Nursery Coordinator.



The Staff Parish Relations Committee, in looking over the positions, thinking through responsibilities,

and having conversations with Catherine, decided the best course of action would be to hire a part-time Nursery Coordinator, to work with our preschool and infants, and have Catherine be our Director of Children's Ministry. The Nursery Coordinator would be responsible for ensuring our nursery is hospitable and safe to all our younger children who participate in it and would work in conjunction with Catherine to offer age-appropriate Christian curriculum for them on Sundays. Moreover, this part-time position would help schedule the other nursery staff on a week-to-week basis.
